ACCEPTABLE

Shirts

Shirts must be tucked in & have collars or mock collars and sleeves.

Trousers / Shorts

Knee length tailored shorts or long trousers.

Socks

Long, Ankle & Trainer socks.

Shoes

Golf shoes.



UNACCEPTABLE

Shirts

Untucked shirts, T-shirts, Vests, Rugby/Football Shirts, Blue Denim.

Shorts

More than 4" above knee. Beach Shorts, Rugby/Football Shorts, Blue Denim.

Socks

No socks.

Shoes

Trainers or improper golf shoes.

DRESS RULES

FOR COURSE & PRACTICE FACILITIES

ACCEPTABLE

Shirts

Shirts must have collars. Shirts designed to be worn outside shorts are acceptable.



Socks

Long, Ankle & Trainer socks.

UNACCEPTABLE

Shirts

Cropped tops/ Strappy tops, T-shirts etc, Blue Denim.



Shorts/Skirts

More than 4" above knee. Beach Shorts, Blue Denim.

No Socks.

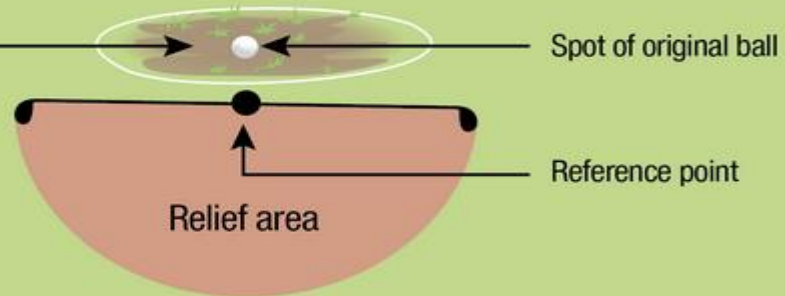

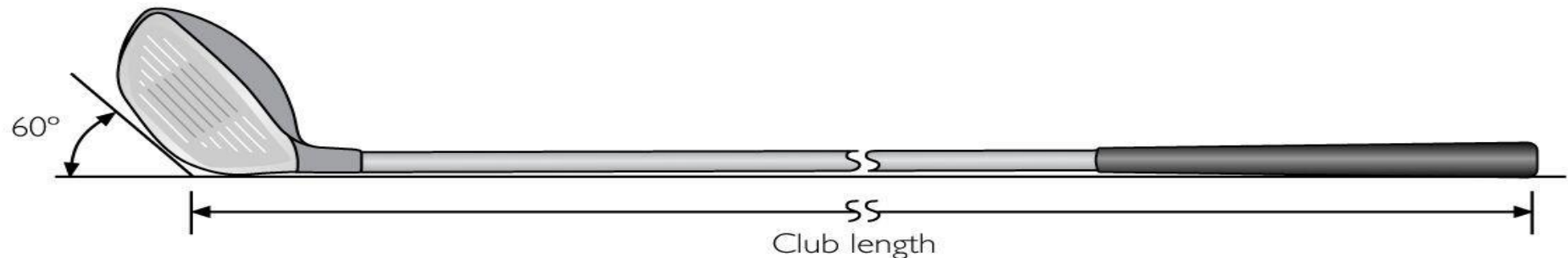
Abnormal course condition

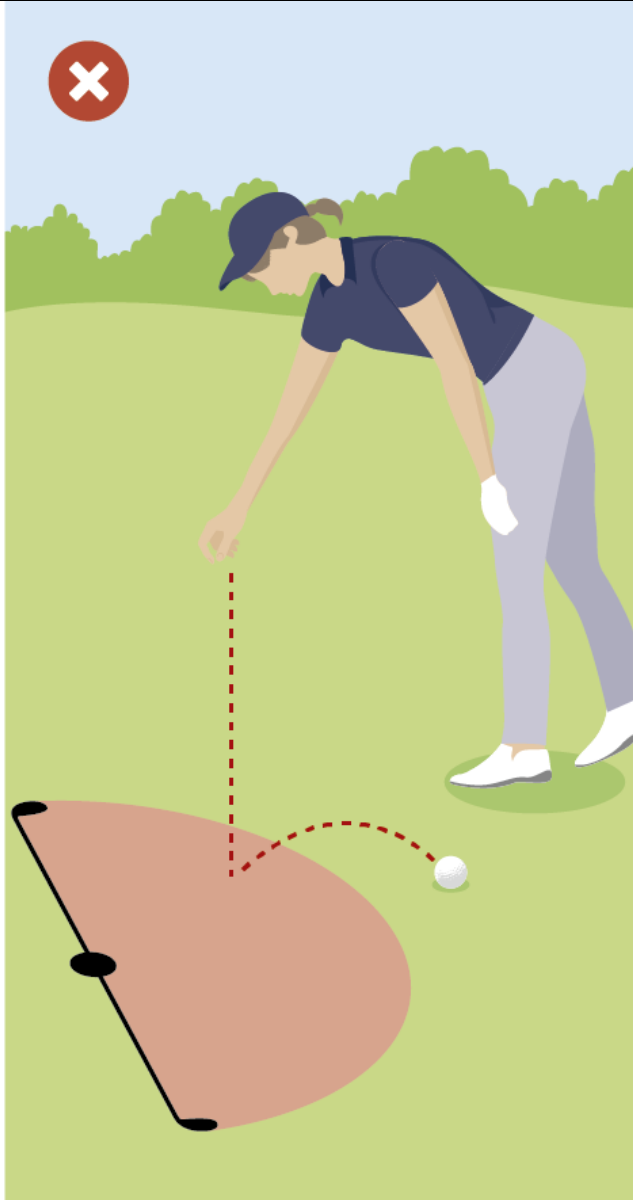
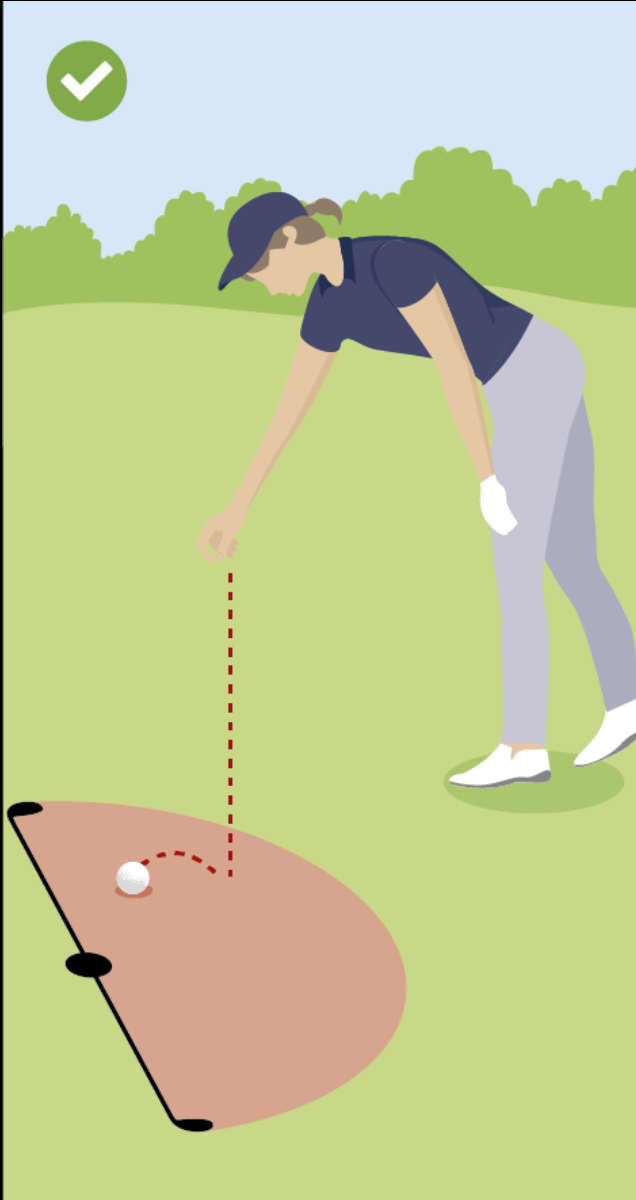


- Free relief is allowed when the ball is in the general area and there is interference by an abnormal course condition.
- The nearest point of complete relief should be identified and a ball must be dropped in and come to rest in the relief area.
- The relief area is one club-length from the reference point, is not nearer to the hole than the reference point and must be in the general area.
- When taking relief, the player must take complete relief from all interference by the abnormal course condition.

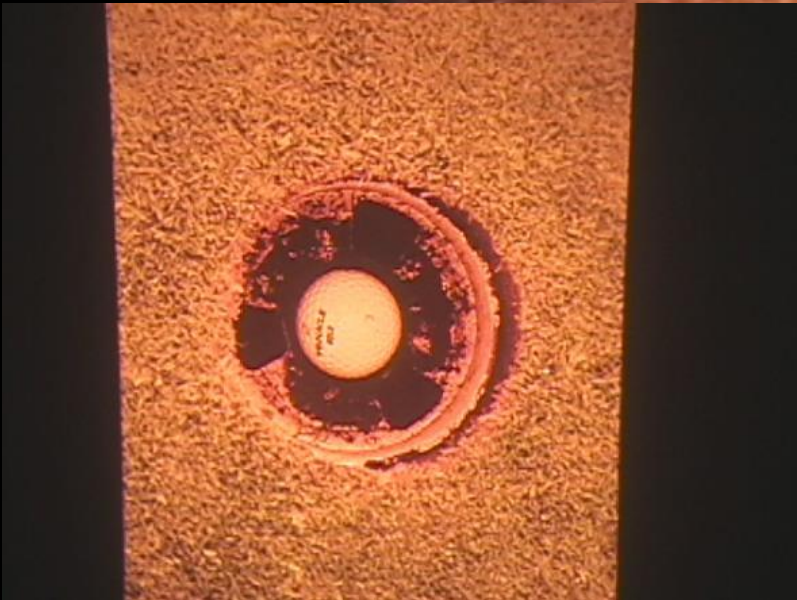
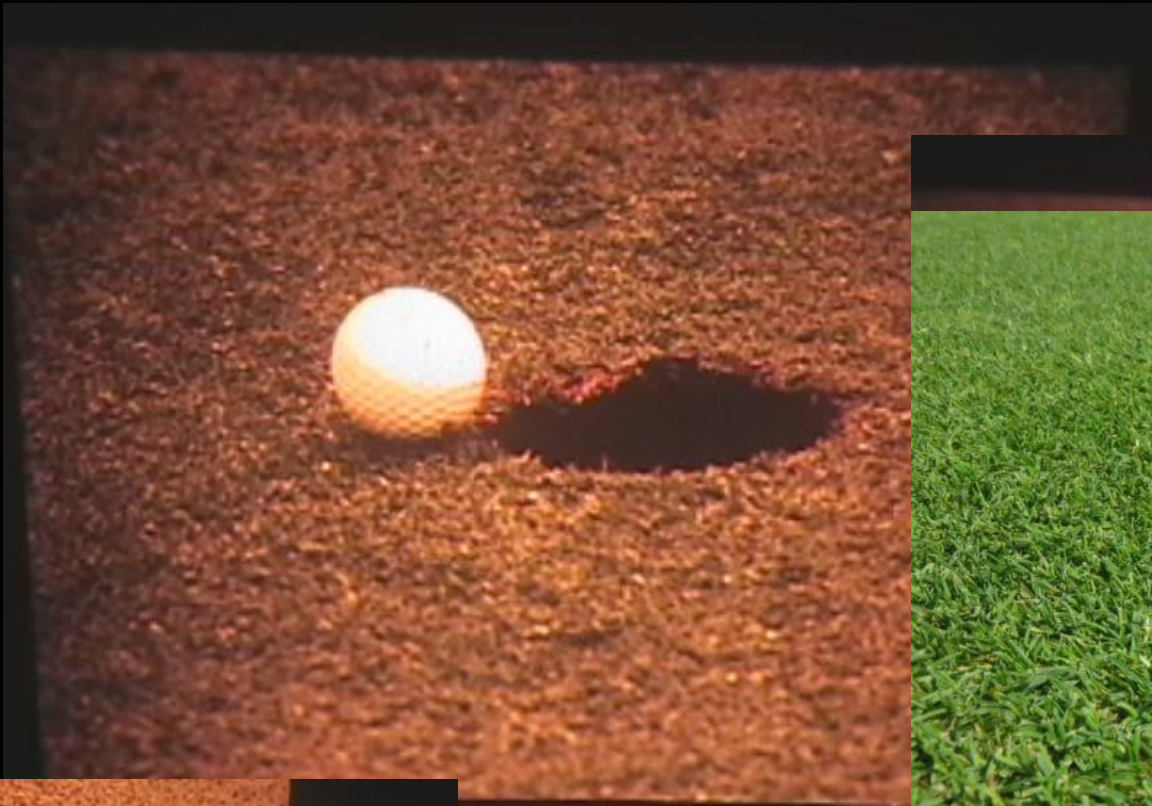

IMPEDIMENTS



New in the Rules for 2019, you may remove loose impediments that lie anywhere on or off the course.

There previously were restrictions against moving them in a hazard, but you may now move loose impediments that lie in any area of the course, including in a bunker or a penalty area.

While you may remove loose impediments anywhere, you should take care to not move your ball in doing so. If the removal of a loose impediment causes your ball to move, you must replace the ball on its original spot and you usually get a one-stroke penalty.

GOLF'S NEW RULES: STROKE AND DISTANCE

A new Local Rule provides an alternative to stroke-and-distance relief for a ball that is lost outside a penalty area or out of bounds, effective January 1, 2019.

BALL OUT OF BOUNDS



LOST BALL



If the Local Rule is in effect, you can still take stroke-and-distance relief, but you now have the following additional option that comes with a penalty of two strokes:

A DETERMINE SPOT where your ball went out of bounds (left diagram) or is likely to be lost (right diagram).

B FIND NEAREST FAIRWAY EDGE no closer to the hole.

C DROP YOUR BALL IN SHADED AREA as defined on one side by a line from the hole through point A and on the other side by a line from the hole through point B, and not nearer the hole. The relief area is extended on both sides by two club-lengths.

This Local Rule is not intended for higher levels of play, such as professional or elite amateur level competitions.
